- Evaluate options for circumstances when the family of a child/adolescent seems to be part of the problem.
- Discuss the concepts of mild cognitive impairment, dementia, "vascular depression", and apathy in the elderly and how they are related to executive dysfunction.
- Review current treatment options for dementia, depression, and apathy, including how to evaluate treatment efficacy.
- Present methods for assessing agitation in the elderly.
- Review both non-pharmacological and pharmacological treatments of agitation, including evidence-based information on determining when and how to use antipsychotics in the elderly.
- Identify psychiatric complications of diabetes and their interplay with diabetic control.
- Discuss successful practice decision-making strategies.
- Discuss recent initiatives in health care reform and psychiatry's role.
