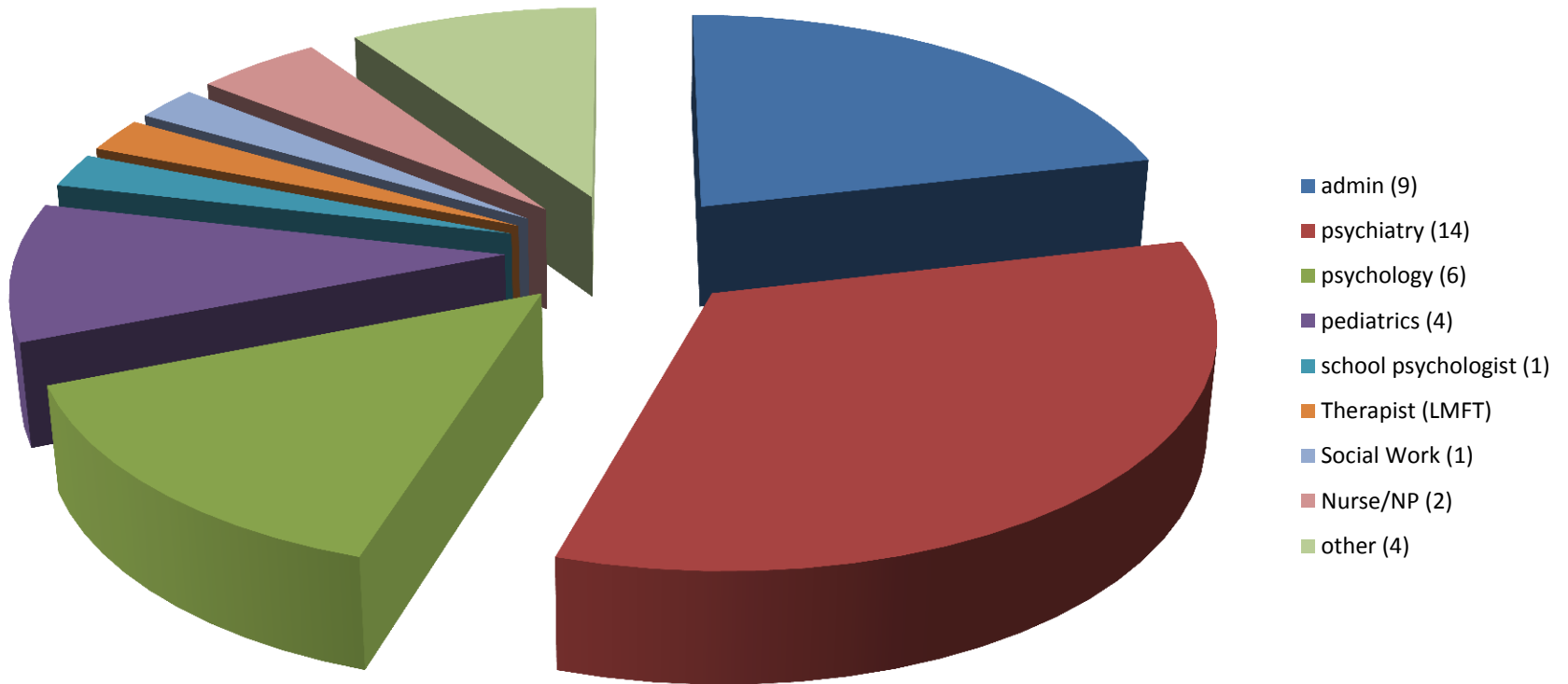

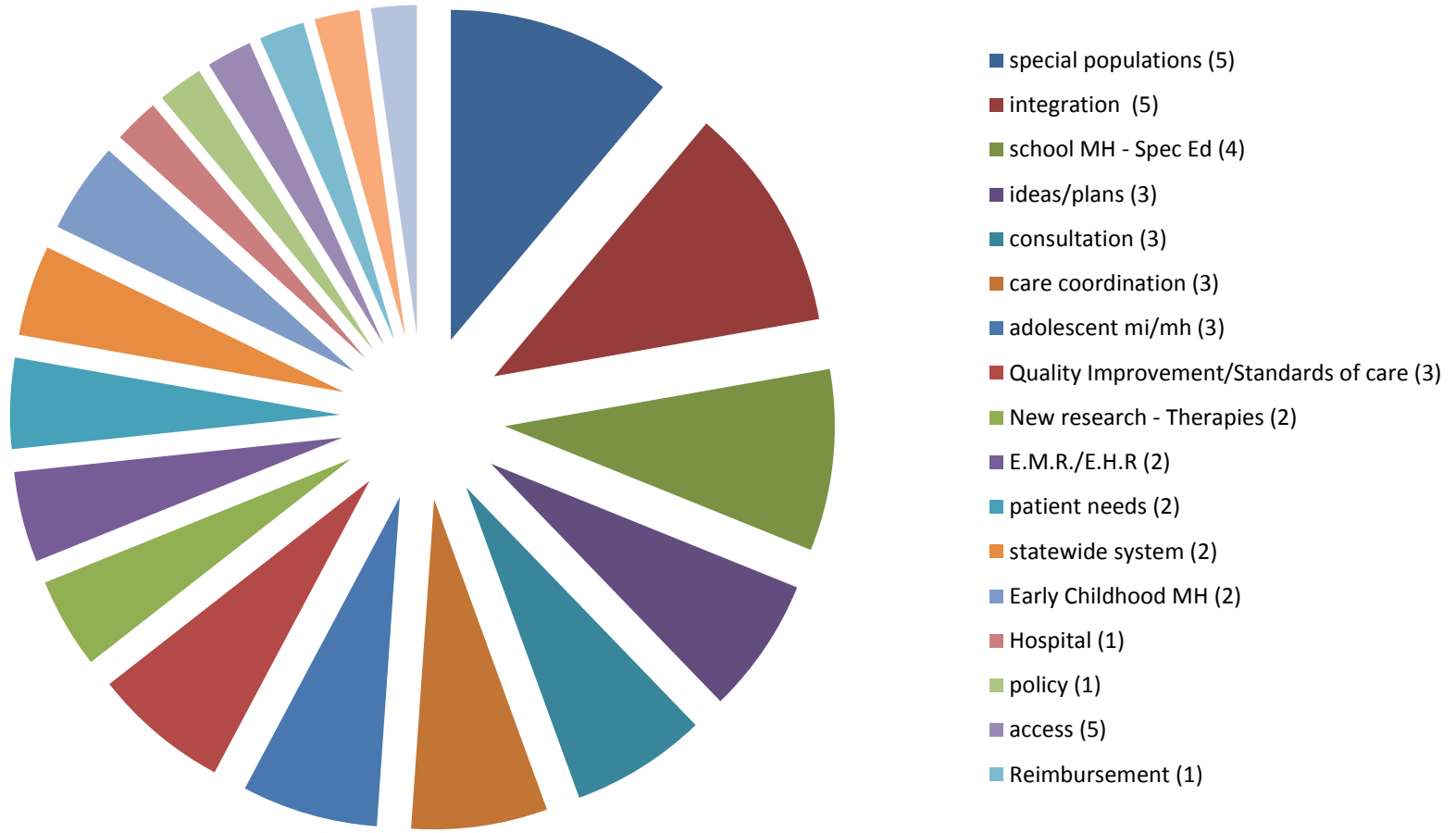

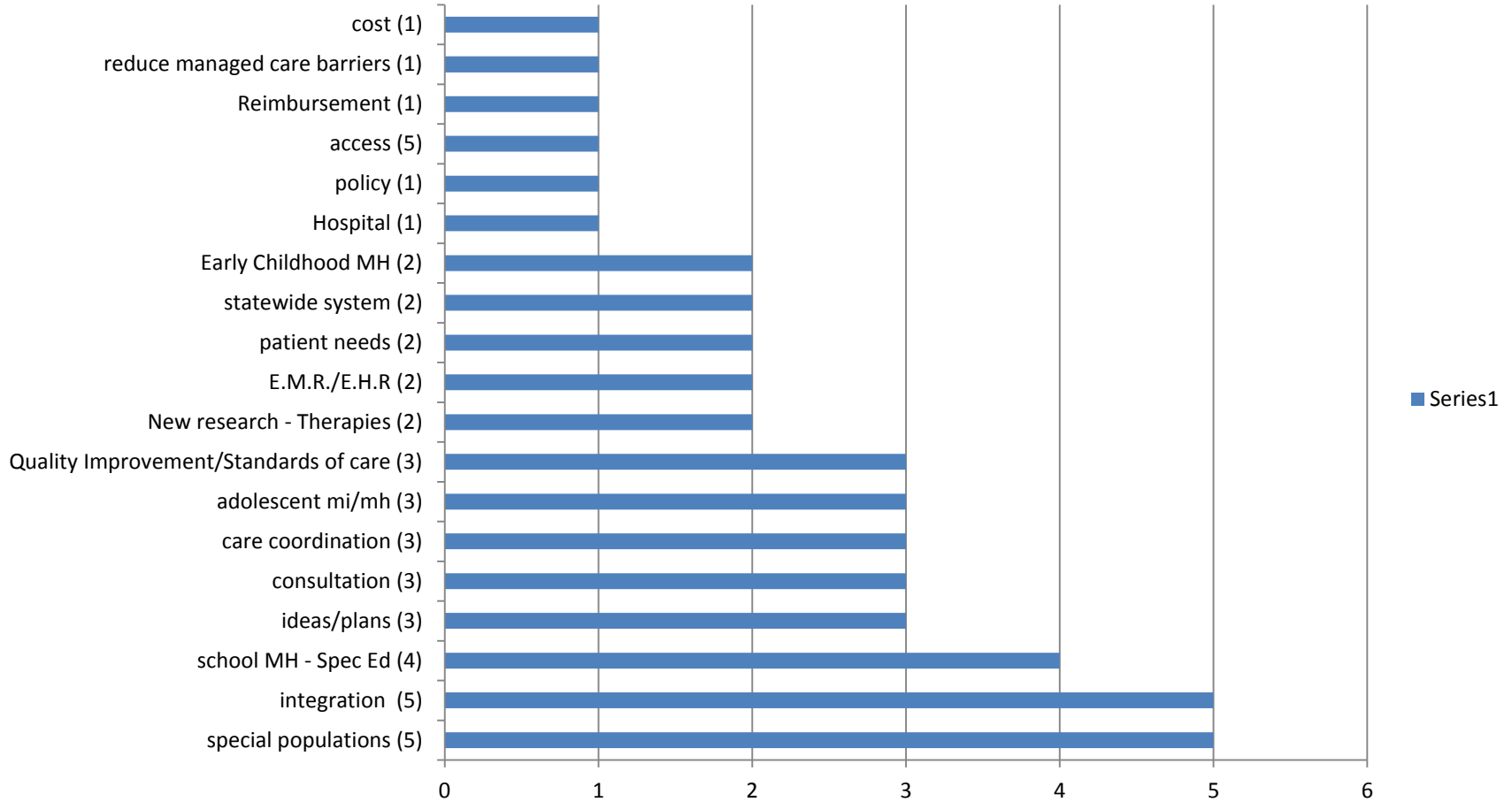
Summit Participants by Discipline



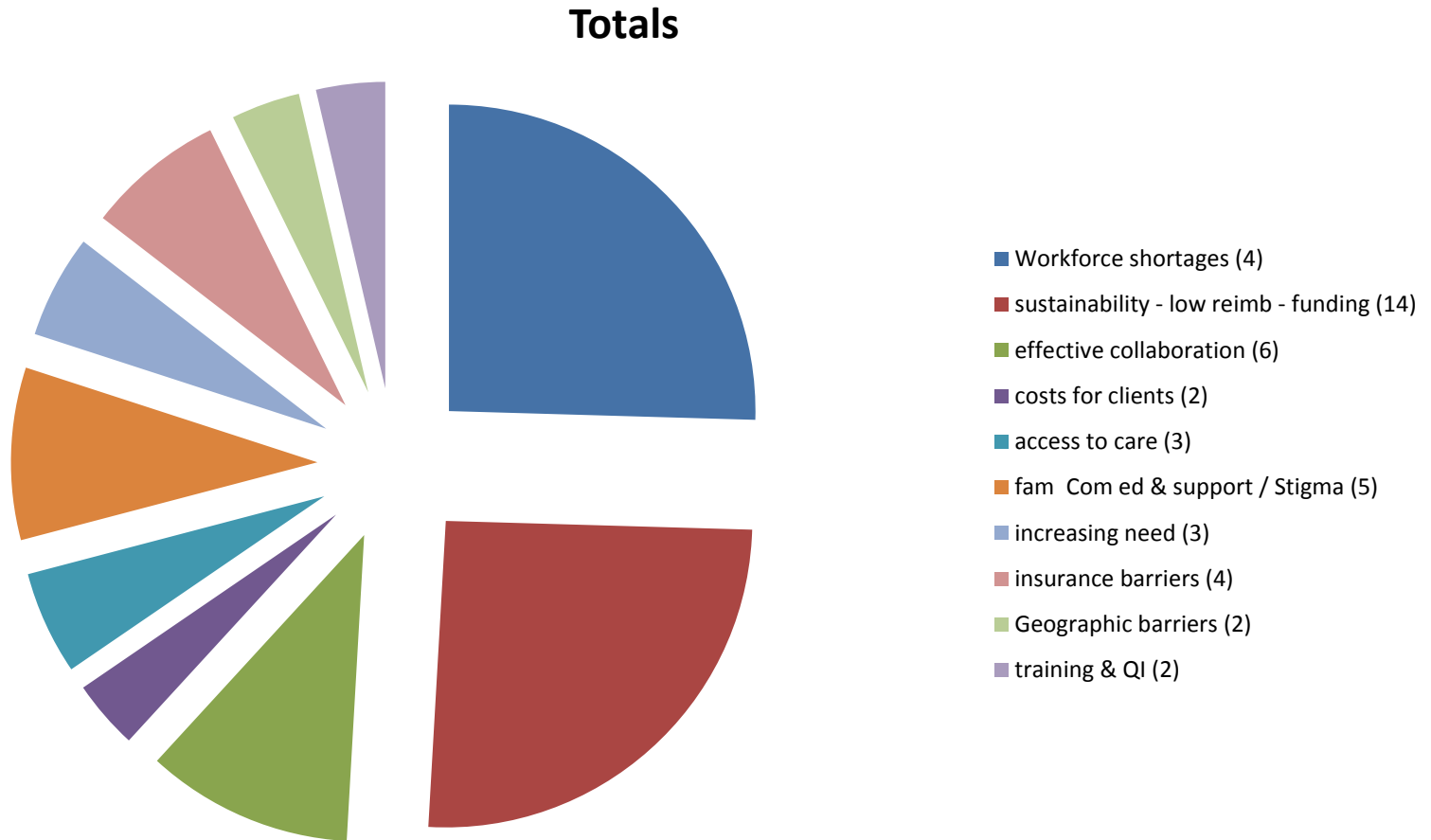

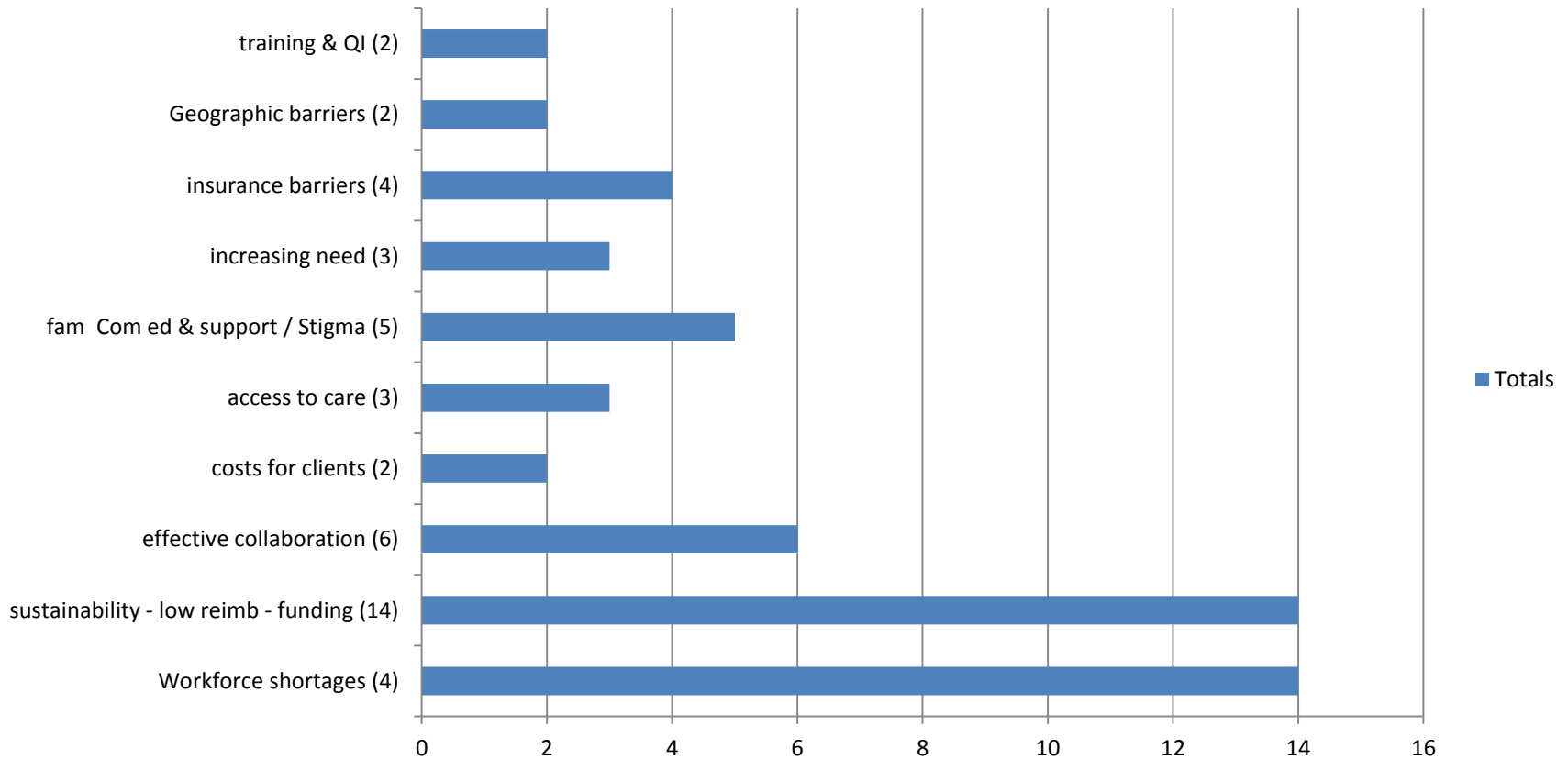


What are your greatest challenges and/or concerns?

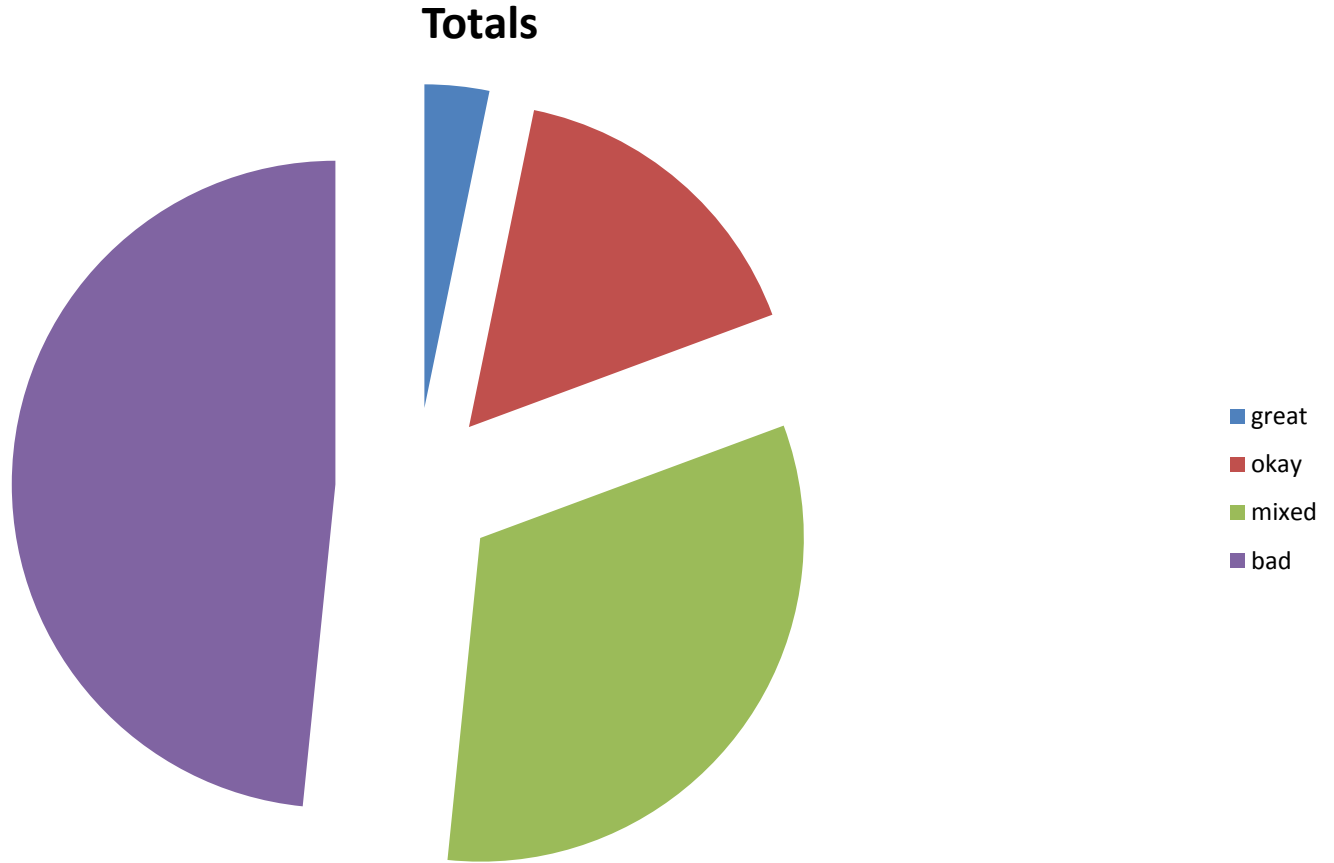

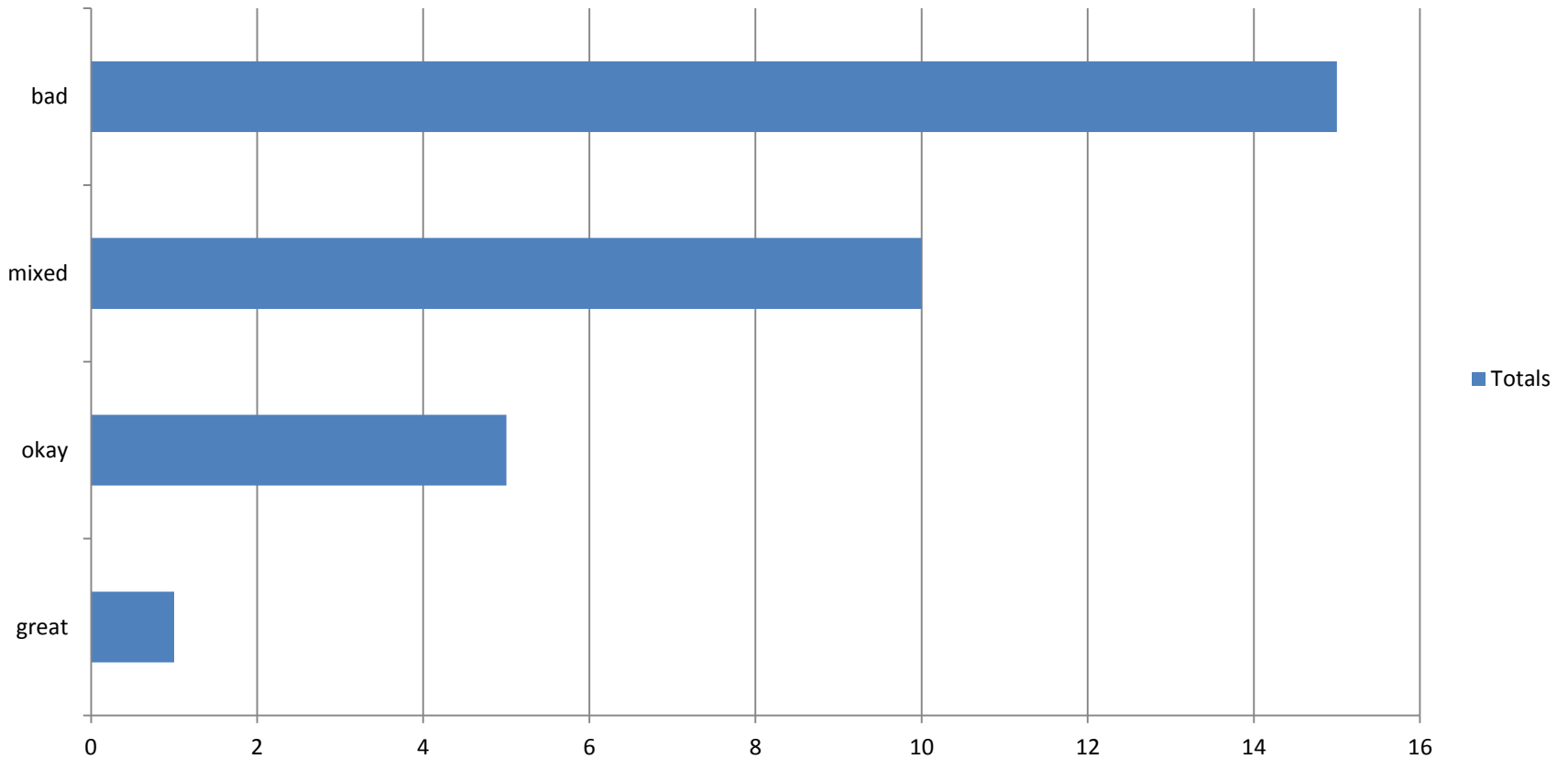

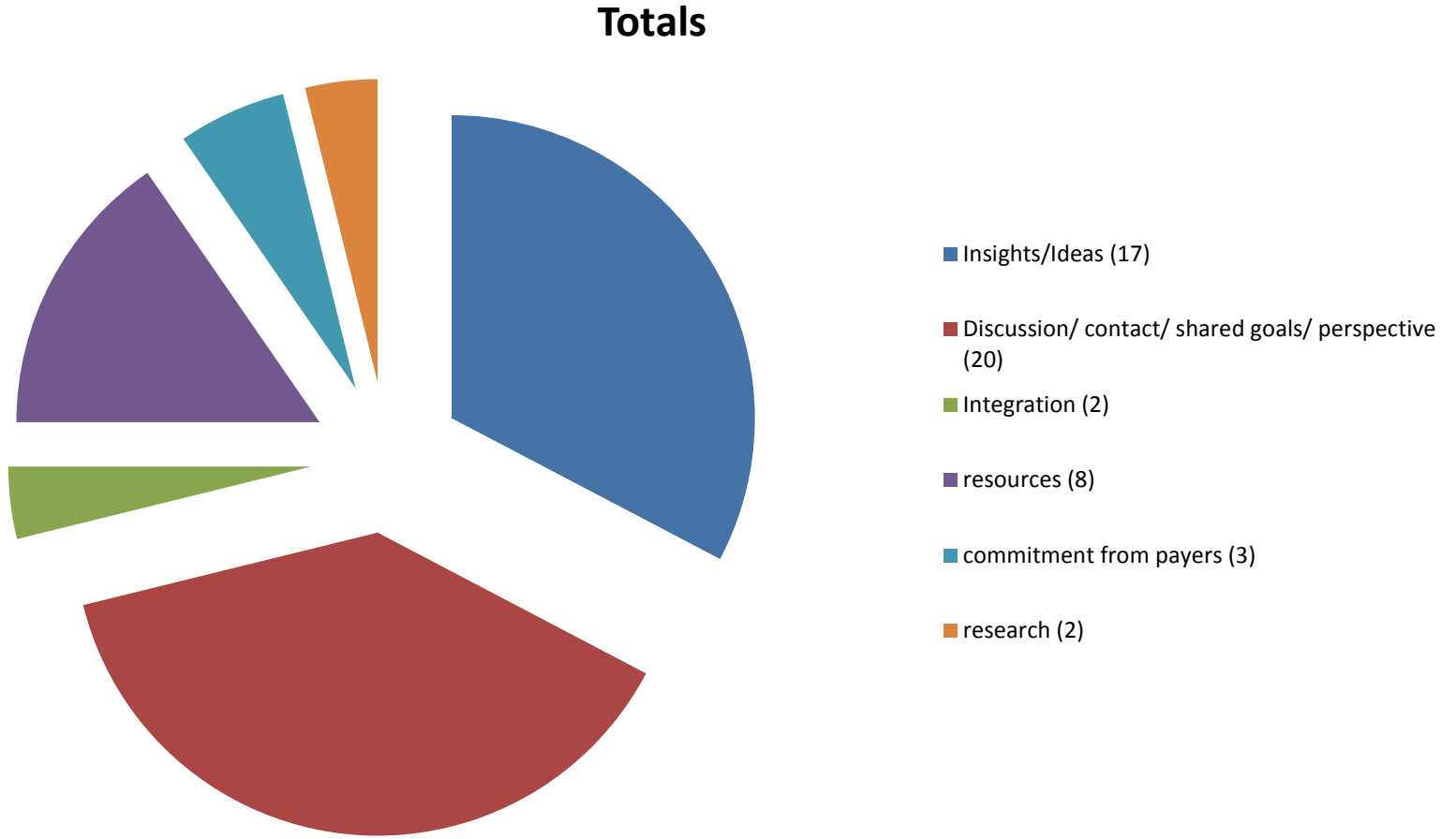

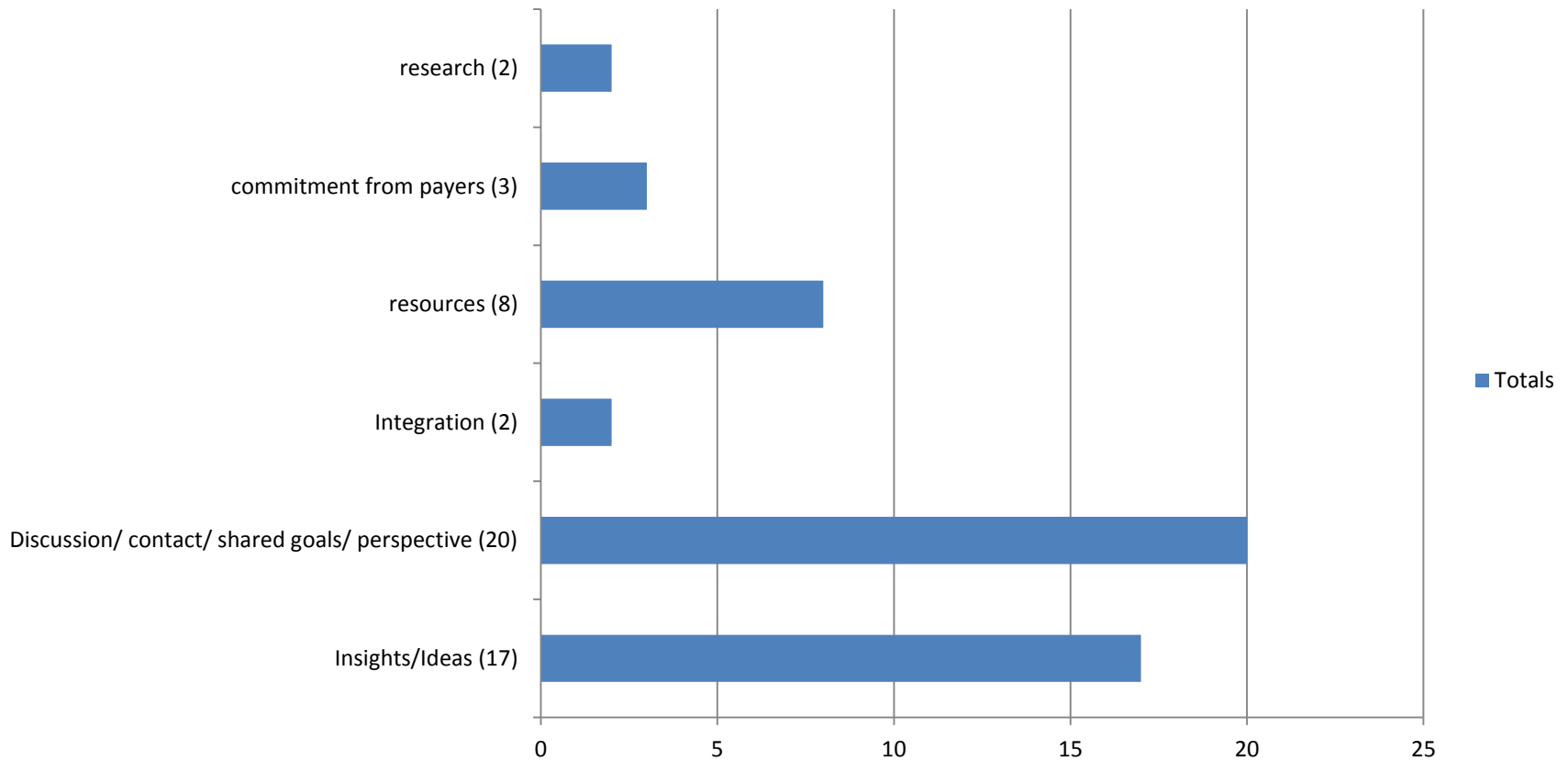

Solutions shared

- Patient-centered medical home
- Yes, our video conferencing service
- Minnesota has developed a very robust children's mental health benefit set in its state Medicaid plan.
- Will share
- Telephone--in real time, email and face to face consult service
- I try to consult with prescribers, especially if there is new information, or information the client may not be giving.
- Very efficient and effective model for addressing complex multi-faceted cases
- Some suicide interventions from indian reservations
- Better understand total cost of care, not cost shifting.
- Role of EMR/EHR in facilitating coordination of care.
- It is helpful to review patterns of work and make sure that the work is being done at the appropriate level to use skill and people most efficiently.
- Yes; adhere to Rule 29 standards in order to address individual clinicians' preferences/standards of care; have enough face to face meetings to foster communication and peer review; and make sure that those in leadership positions have the skills to lead.
- We have several exciting efforts that tend to be focused on adults but could easily be generalized to kids and adolescents. These include EMACS (which is a mobile community crisis team that also signs patients up and get them onto insurance), CCDS, Mental Health Drug Assistance Program, Mental Health Crisis Alliance, and our Civil Legal Issues Quarterly Meeting to help improve, shorten the process for commitment and improve workflow.
